Most of the hotels that ring Lake Como are traditional *albergo*, whether grand or simple, plus a few privately owned bed and breakfast establishments. Villa Vittoria is an exception: with the feel of a lakeside villa, it's more intimate, more boutique and more fashionable than most of the other choices.

**Location** 8/10

Once you have turned off the main road that skirts the lake, the hotel's low-key entrance can be difficult to spot, with a small courtyard in front of the house. Its garden sit right on the lake; there is parking for guests' cars nearby.

**Style/character** 8/10

A successful amalgam of stylish boutique hotel and relaxing private villa. The tone is set by the huge ground floor sitting room, formerly three separate rooms, with sofas, armchairs, original Murano glass chandeliers and a grand piano. The style is unmistakably Italian, with glossy touches, but it also has a light, airy, almost Scandinavian feel. The house was once a laboratory for silk production: mulberry trees (one still remains) were grown in the garden and the owners found the mummified remains of silkworms in the attic.

**Service/facilities** 10/10

Villa Vittoria is a fully-fledged hotel in miniature, with everything you could want, including a (small but attractive) infinity swimming pool overlooking the lake and (small but attractive) spa, atmospheric basement enoteca and conservatory restaurant, plus canoes and bikes at guests' disposal. Owner Daniella, who was born in her parents hotel on the island of Ponza, is hands-on, welcoming and has high standards; staff are smartly dressed and try their best to create an atmosphere of relaxed well-being, though some are a little amateur.

**Rooms** 8/10

The 13 bedrooms are delightful and even the smallest ones, though they lack a view of the lake, are attractive, with sponged walls, floaty white curtains and earthy hues. Lake View Rooms have balconies, and the Lake View Suite consists of two large bedrooms.

**Food & drink** 7/10

Though the breakfast buffet is nothing special, the food at dinner in the glass-encased Veranda restaurant is excellent, and includes local specialities such as the lake fish lavaret.

**Value for money** 8/10

Double rooms from £130 per night, including breakfast. The range of prices, from a very acceptable Cozy Room to the luxurious Lake View Suite, is useful and suits most pockets. Free Wi-Fi.

**Access for guests with disabilities?**  
Yes; lift.

**Family-friendly?**  
Yes: well behaved children.
